Check out the only Four Historic Corners in the country; the crossroads of four historic buildings listed on the National Historical Registry.

10:30 AM - Tour the **Wegner Grotto**, constructed between 1929 and 1936, the concrete sculptures of the grotto are set with a brilliant mosaics of shattered glass and broken crockery. Combining their fantastic vision with such an imaginative use of unexpected materials, the Wegner's Grotto stands as a significant work of art.

12:30 PM - Lunch at **The Cotter Pin**. Enjoy a full menu including wraps, paninis, pizza, salads and sandwiches. The Cotter Pin is also a wine and craft beer and gift shop that sells unique gifts. Call (608) 487-8118 for reservations.

1:30 PM — Tour the **Elroy- Sparta Bike Trail**, the very first Rails to Trails program in the country! This trail is the first example of a new initiative in which old railroads tracks were converted into bike trails. There are now thousands of miles across the country, and it started right here in Sparta, making us the Bicycling Capital of America!

2:30 PM -Enjoy one of our area's most scenic drives and travel south on Highway 27 toward Cashton and visit **Down a Country Road**, a wonderful collections of shops specializing in Amish gifts, furniture and so much more!
